

Local Government Authorities Arts and Cultural Program Outcomes

Aboriginal Arts and Culture (1) \$100,000

1. Moree Plains Shire Council Dhiiyaan Aboriginal Centre digitisation program (**\$100,000 total 1 year**)

The Dhiiyaan Aboriginal Centre in Moree holds an important archival collection of materials relating to the history and culture of the Gamilaroi people of Northern NSW. The program aims to digitise this invaluable archive collection through the creation of a local digital Aboriginal Keeping Place.

Multi-arts & Festivals (7) \$1,370,000

1. Blacktown City Council Blacktown Arts (**\$200,000 total 1 year**)

- Blacktown Arts will deliver a multi-form program across venues and sites throughout Blacktown. Blacktown will work with a diverse range of artists communities and partners through First Nations collaborations, public programs, exhibitions and live performance. Blacktown will also invest in local artist capacity building and sector development projects.

2. Campbelltown City Council Campbelltown Arts Centre (**\$450,000 per annum for 3 years**)

- Located on Dharawal land, Campbelltown Arts Centre (C-A-C) will present a challenging multidisciplinary artistic program that will be conceived locally and resonate globally. C-A-C will commission, create and collaborate with artists and connect our growing community to the arts through contemporary visual arts, music, performance, dance and emerging artforms.

3. Canterbury Bankstown Council Bankstown Arts Centre (**\$50,000 total 1 year**)

- Bankstown Arts Centre's Contemporary Arts Program will focus on a multi-arts curated program, supporting First Nation artists and will include artists in residence, performances, exhibitions and public programs, inter-cultural exchange and engagement working with key arts and community partners.

4. Lake Macquarie City Council Lake Macquarie Arts and Cultural Program (**\$150,000 per annum for 3 years**)

- Lake Macquarie Arts and Cultural Program is a holistic and committed approach to developing creative excellence in the City. Through the delivery of artistic projects and interventions the City will develop the value and provision of contemporary visual and performing arts, music and dance, public art, place activation, museum and heritage for the community.

5. Lismore City Council Lismore Quadrangle Multi-Arts Program (**\$70,000 total 1 year**)

- The Quad is the central village green space for the local community of the Northern Rivers. The Quad will present a multi-arts contemporary community arts and culture program that is free, openly accessible and connects to place.

6. Liverpool City Council Casula Powerhouse Arts Centre (**\$250,000 total 1 year**)

- Casula Powerhouse Arts Centre (CPAC) is a distinctively different institution in South Western Sydney that connects people, ideas and culture through a multi-disciplinary arts program encompassing visual arts, music, performance, theatre, education, events and festivals. CPAC will present a diverse program that reflects their commitment to local stories and global perspectives.

7. Penrith City Council per annum Penrith Performing & Visual Arts Ltd Penrith Performing & Visual Arts (\$200,000 total 1 year)

- Penrith Performing & Visual Arts will deliver arts and cultural activities through the Q Theatre, The Joan, Penrith Regional Gallery, Home of the Lewers' Bequest as well as Penrith Conservatorium. This three-year program will distil activity into a streamlined framework for capacity building, creation, and sharing.

Museums & History (4) \$356,181

1. Coffs Harbour City Council Community Curators Program, Coffs Harbour Regional Museum (\$72,300 total 1 year)

- The program will locate and generate stories and content to diversify the collections and exhibitions of the museum, through a program of training and community engagement. Community-based workers will be empowered to identify stories and objects not currently represented and work with arts/cultural workers to create content for the new museum.

2. Newcastle City Council Newcastle Museum (\$135,000 per annum for 3 years)

- Newcastle Museum's primary purpose is to engage and service broad visitation through collections, exhibitions and programming. In the midst of exciting changes; physically, structurally and in the way Newcastle Museum will engage with the community through 3 years of themed programming: 1. Seeing Differently, 2. Neighbours and 3. Fluidity.

3. Orange City Council Orange Regional Museum (\$63,881 total 1 year)

- Orange Regional Museum's program will facilitate meaningful cultural experiences for audiences. The Museum will engage and include visitors in ways which encourage them to develop new and deeper perspectives on the culture and history of the region and beyond through innovative exhibitions and education programs, developed in partnership with the community.

4. Wagga Wagga City Council Museum of the Riverina, Wagga Wagga (\$85,000 total 1 year)

- The Museum of the Riverina (MoR) interprets the history and identity of Wagga Wagga and wider region through revealing the stories of people, place and environment. It enriches community life encouraging learning, innovation and participation. MoR seeks to lead the way in developing innovative approaches to community participation, interpretation and presentation of cultural heritage collections in regional Australia.

Theatre (2) \$240,000

1. Bathurst Regional Council Bathurst Memorial Entertainment Centre (\$40,000 in year 1, \$80,000 in each of years 2 and 3)

- Bathurst Memorial Entertainment Centre is a regional centre connecting local performing arts appreciation and practice to the world.
- 2. City of Parramatta Council Riverside's National Theatre of Parramatta (\$200,000 per annum for 3 years)**
 - National Theatre of Parramatta (NTofP) produces an annual professional theatre program in Western Sydney, aimed at inspiring and connecting with existing and new audiences from local diverse communities. NTofP commissions, creates, produces, presents and tours work, building capacity by nurturing talent, providing training, mentorship and networking opportunities for artists.

Visual Arts (15) \$1,032,500

- 1. Albury City Council Murray Art Museum Albury (\$50,000 in year 1 and \$100,000 in each of years 2 & 3)**
 - Develop audiences through a challenging and engaging artistic program that is driven by artists and is in conversation with national and international arts practice.
- 2. Bathurst Regional Council Bathurst Regional Art Gallery (\$100,000 per annum for 3 years)**
 - Bathurst Regional Art Gallery will continue to support contemporary art practice in regional NSW through a curated program of exhibitions, education and public programs, residencies, public art projects, and partnerships that support artists and engage a wide cross-section of the community to enhance the cultural vibrancy of the region.
- 3. Broken Hill City Council Broken Hill Regional Art Gallery (\$100,000 per annum for 3 years)**
 - The Broken Hill Regional Art Gallery will provide a dynamic cultural hub for Broken Hill and the region through supporting arts practice and engagement with the arts, by inspiring and stimulating ideas and by encouraging conversations. This will be achieved through a dynamic set of programs, exhibitions and artist residence programs.
- 4. City of Parramatta Council Parramatta Artists' Studios (\$50,000 in year 1 and \$100,000 in year 2)**
 - Artists and community are at the centre of the work of Parramatta Artists' Studios (PAS). PAS develops and sustains artists' careers by supporting the production of work and the development of industry networks. PAS will deliver public programs that provide valuable participation for audiences, placing ideas generation and making at the centre of the PAS community.
- 5. Cumberland City Council The Granville Centre Art Gallery (\$65,000 total 1 year)**
 - The Granville Centre Art Gallery will deliver innovative contemporary exhibitions, artist commissions, public programs, artist development and community arts and cultural development opportunities. It will enable Cumberland's diverse communities, artists and cultural practitioners' access to a new dynamic creative hub in the heart of Granville.
- 6. Goulburn Mulwaree Council Goulburn Regional Art Gallery (\$90,000 per annum for 3 years)**
 - Goulburn Regional Art Gallery's program is built around exhibitions profiling living and local artists. This content flows into public programs, education and outreach activities delivering creative-learning and engagement opportunities for our regional audience.

Reflecting its position as the region's only public gallery, the program champions excellence, innovation and best-practice.

7. Lismore City Council Lismore Regional Gallery (\$42,500 in year 1 and \$85,000 in each of years 2 & 3)

- Lismore Regional Gallery's will work closely with contemporary artists and the community in the development of new work to provide enriching cultural experiences. The Gallery will take a broad approach, ensuring their program supports a diverse community including those with access needs, and those with varying abilities.

8. Maitland City Council Maitland Regional Art Gallery (\$70,000 per annum for 3 years)

- Maitland Regional Art Gallery's (MRAG) artistic program presents thousands of artworks and creates hundreds of learning activities in delivering diverse impacts for its regional community. Through a focus on artistic excellence, diversity, connection and creative learning, MRAG will support regional artists and audiences, creating a culturally connected community.

9. Mosman Municipal Council Mosman Art Gallery (MAG) (\$50,000 total 1 year)

- Mosman Art Gallery (MAG) will develop and present its artistic program based on the programming streams of Contemporary Arts Practice, Heritage, First Nations, Innovation, Access and Artist Development and International Engagement. MAG aims to engage local, national and international audiences and partners in critical dialogue and best practice programming.

10. Newcastle City Council Newcastle Art Gallery (\$75,000 per annum for 3 years)

- Newcastle Art Gallery's program is an ambitious mix of exhibitions and events engaging local, national and international audiences. While showcasing the city's substantial and nationally significant collection, the proposed program will also continue the Gallery's commitment to supporting and celebrating a diverse mix of artists and practitioners.

11. Orange City Council Orange Regional Gallery (\$65,000 per annum for 3 years)

- Orange Regional Gallery Program will present a series of local, state and international exhibitions with associated engagement and education programs. The program aims to facilitate the exchange and production of ideas between artists and audiences and create the conditions for the production of new work in NSW.

12. Sutherland Shire Council Hazelhurst Arts Centre (\$40,000 total 1 year)

- Hazelhurst Arts Centre is a community hub and leading creative centre for southern Sydney. Hazelhurst aims to produce and present an ambitious and diverse program of exhibitions, art classes, public and education programs that will actively and meaningfully engage audiences with the visual arts, while supporting artists and arts workers.

13. Tamworth Regional Council Tamworth Regional Gallery per annum Creating an Arts Ecosystem (\$70,000 per annum for 2 years)

- For 100 years, the Tamworth Regional Gallery has provided access to the arts in a regional centre. The Gallery offers a distinctive connection to place and a curatorial

agenda that creates meaningful art experiences. The Gallery places art, access and audiences at the core of who they are to guide the Gallery's artistic and public programs.

14. Tweed Shire Council Tweed Regional Gallery (\$100,000 total 1 year)

- Tweed Regional Gallery (TRGMOAC) will present dynamic, quality arts experiences through four strategic focus areas per annum to lead, inspire, engage and connect. With a focused and holistic approach to exhibition, education and public programming, TRGMOAC will showcase excellence in regional and national visual arts practice.

15. Wagga Wagga City Council Wagga Wagga Art Gallery (\$65,000 total 1 year)

- The Gallery's forthcoming program welcomes audiences and cultural practitioners into this new era through annual programming traversing community. Wagga Wagga Art Gallery will present an inaugural program which thrives on positive relationships and cultural diversity and protects and promotes its Wiradjuri and First Nations' culture.
