

Create NSW Arts & Cultural Funding Program – 2021/22 Round Local Government Authority

Local Government Authority (17) \$1,394,500.00

Aboriginal Arts and Culture (1) \$50,000

1. Coffs Harbour City Council, Yaam Gumbaynggirr Jagun: Here is Gumbaynggirr Country, Coffs Harbour Regional Gallery (\$50,000 total 1 year)

- Coffs Harbour Regional Gallery's Yaam Gumbaynggirr Jagun project will engage a First Nations curator to commission new artworks and curate an exhibition of emerging and established Gumbaynggirr artists for the opening of the new cultural and civic space.

Multi Artform (4) \$459,500

1. Blacktown City Council, 2022 Blacktown Arts Program (\$220,000 total 1 year)

- Blacktown Arts will deliver a multi artform program across diverse venues and sites throughout Blacktown. Strong First Nations collaborations will lead Blacktown's public programs, exhibitions and live performances with relevant and diverse range of artists, communities and partners. Blacktown Arts will invest in artist capacity building and sector development throughout the annual program.

2. Canterbury Bankstown Council, Sub-Terrains Bankstown Biennale 2022, (\$100,000 total 1 year)

- Sub-Terrains Bankstown Biennale 2022 is a contemporary multi arts event comprising artist residencies and the development of new works that will culminate in a major exhibition. This project will deliver public programs including forums and workshops that offer ideas for transformation and change, with sovereignty at the centre of these activations.

3. Dubbo Regional Council, Dubbo Regional Council Cultural Growth Project 2021-2023 (\$89,500 per annum for 3 years)

- Dubbo Regional Council will prioritise the importance of collaborating with the local community, engaging with audiences, embracing diversity, experimentation and supporting local artists and practitioners. The 2021-2023 program will, through arts, performance and cultural projects, increase access, equity and diversification, radically expanding cultural experiences and opportunities.

4. Fairfield City Council, 2021 Fairfield City Museum and Gallery Program (\$50,000 total 1 year)

- Fairfield City Museum and Gallery will present a hybrid program of contemporary art, social history and audience engagement projects, which places at the forefront Western Sydney artists, cultural workers and practitioners. The program highlights Fairfield's unique track record of strengthening and working hand-in-hand with culturally diverse communities while developing professional pathways for artists and creatives.

Contemporary Music (1) \$120,000

1. City of Parramatta Council Live Music Parramatta (\$120,000 per annum for 3 years)

- Live Music Parramatta encompasses multiple programs aimed at employing and supporting musicians, producers and music industry workers from Western Sydney. Live Music Parramatta will also focus on bringing the whole of Western Sydney together in solidarity at the proposed key events; the Area, the multi-Council Warumi Hip Hop event and live venue development.

Museums and History (3) \$180,000

- 1. Hawkesbury City Council, 2021/22 Annual Program Funding for Hawkesbury Regional Museum (\$50,000 total 1 year)**
 - Hawkesbury Regional Museum's 2021-22 program will focus on engaging and encouraging audiences to develop a deeper understanding and connection to the history and culture of the Hawkesbury area through community-partnership programs, exhibitions, experiences at the museum and through increased digital content and delivery.
- 2. Orange City Council, Continuing the Orange Blayney and Cabonne Sustainable Collections Program 2022-2023 (\$40,000 total 1 year)**
 - The 2022-2023 Orange City Council project will continue the award-winning Sustainable Collections Program, documenting and interpreting significant collections across the region. This will include an emphasis on interpretative exhibition planning for new presentations, Aboriginal object interpretation and oral history recording, assessment of archives, and research on the lost villages across the Central NSW regional museum.
- 3. Tweed City Council, Tweed Regional Museum Projects Funding (\$90,000 total 1 year)**
 - Tweed Regional Museum will present three projects each taking programs out into community, and extending audience reach and engagement. Two projects involve a two-part exhibition model incorporating Mobile Museum; the third pilots a new education program model focused on natural heritage and Aboriginal cultural landscape.

Visual Arts (8) \$585,000

- 1. Clarence Valley Council, InlandSee (\$50,000 total 1 year)**

InlandSee is a three-year program of artists residencies and survey exhibitions that demonstrate the cultural viability and importance of Grafton Regional Gallery in a national contemporary visual art context. This project includes a substantial showcase of recent work that highlights the current practice of 54 artistic voices from across NSW.
- 2. Cumberland City Council, Granville Centre Art Gallery 2022 Arts and Cultural Program (\$80,000 total 1 year)**
 - Granville Centre Art Gallery will deliver four key contemporary art exhibitions, including new artwork commissions and public/studio programs. This will include one key artist's solo exhibition development and online programs.

- 3. Mid-Coast Council 2021/22 Exhibition and Program Funding Manning Regional Art Gallery (\$25,000 total 1 year)**
 - The Manning Regional Art Gallery 2021/22 program of exhibitions, performances and events, showcases work from emerging and established artists, high profile touring exhibitions and curated work. The Gallery, based in Taree, serving the Mid-Coast region, is a vibrant cultural hub which nurtures artistic practice and fosters community engagement with the arts.

- 4. Mid-Western Regional Council, Mudgee Regional Art Gallery Annual Program (\$50,000 total 1 year)**
 - For its inaugural year of programming, Mudgee Regional Art Gallery will present a diverse program that reflects a commitment to local artists and community. Mudgee Regional Art Gallery will present new works by local artists and pay overdue acknowledgment to our Wiradjuri artists and their stories.

- 5. Port Macquarie Hastings Council Explore, Excite and Ignite 2021/2022 Creative Learning Program (\$100,000 total 1 year)**
 - Explore, Excite and Ignite 2021/2022 Creative Learning Program is Port Macquarie Hastings Council's inclusive and innovative designed program for regional artists and community members to participate in arts and cultural activities in a sustainable and enriching way. It aims to create more opportunities and strengthen partnerships with industry bodies, artists and the community.

- 6. Sutherland Shire Council, Hazelhurst Arts Centre (\$80,000 total 1 year)**
 - Hazelhurst will present a series of self-curated visual arts projects ranging from solo exhibitions, outdoor installations and critical research exhibitions that support NSW artists and arts workers to present new and existing work. This will also include a series of education and public programs including new accessibility program.

- 7. Tweed Shire Council, Artistic Program Funding (2021-2024) for Tweed Regional Gallery (TRGMOAC) (\$100,000 per annum for 3 years)**
 - During 2021-24 Tweed Regional Gallery (TRGMOAC) will present dynamic, quality visual arts experiences through four strategic focus areas - lead, inspire, engage and connect. With a focused and holistic approach to exhibition, education and public programming, TRGMOAC will showcase excellence in regional and national visual arts practice.

- 8. Wagga Wagga City Council, 2022/23 Wagga Wagga Art Gallery Projects Funding (\$100,000 for 2021/22 and \$95,000 for 2022/23)**
 - Wagga Wagga Art Gallery will innovate the Gallery's programming, build organisational capacity, and diversify audiences through exhibition project development and presentation, regional artists residency and support program and key project partnerships. Projects will support local, regional NSW, Sydney, ACT and First Nations (Wiradjuri) artists and curators.
